 - Focus group members organized a symposium related to the conferences and presentations.
 - Co-chair, Brandon, met with the board of the journal *Family Relations*, developed a call for papers on Artificial Intelligence in Everyday Family Life, and we distributed this call to focus group members.

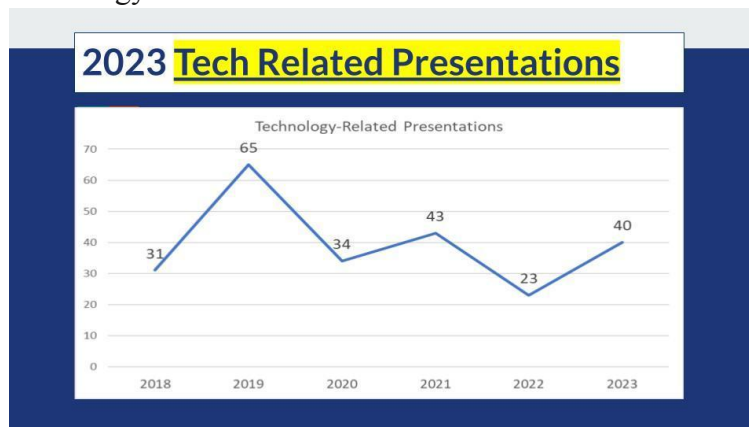
