Best Practices: Northern Thailand

With communities:



- Enter local spaces consciously (dress, behavior)
- Practice ethical & responsible consumption & photography (https://dochas.ie/images-and-messages)
- Don't make promises (help students understand this)
- Reciprocate: Learn and share in communities
- Explore non-verbal ways to engage; come prepared

Best Practices: Northern Thailand With local partners: → Debrief with partners

- Return multiple times to demonstrate commitment
- Consider how you can build an eventual exchange, at least with key staff/partners
- Compensate financially as if in your own space



Tips for developing community partnerships

- Communicate learning objectives clearly
- Longer-term relationships help learning objectives be realized over time
- Logistics work through creditable educational study abroad company (I use CEPA-Abroad https://www.cepa-abroad.org/ specializes in customized faculty-led learning abroad programs)




Future Goals: Northern Thailand

➤ Since inception in 2006

PACI

- Concentrated in fewer places & rural areas
- Honed learning experiences
 - → Expanded to include Hmong in Laos in addition to Thailand, added Karen in 2017, hope to add Lahu or Akha in 2018
 - Discovered Child Safe organization and Center for Girls in 2016
- May move to a focus on graduate education in 2019









- Recruitment is a lot of work
- > Be visible, recruit outside of your program!
- Use student feedback to re-tool curriculum and help shape student expectations for next year
- Understand and respect our students' backgrounds to prepare them:
 - Non-traditional, 1st generation, no dorm experience, family background



- Give students down time for processing
- Use a Google Doc for students to make an annotated "Best Of" list that they can share with the class and future students
- Use trauma-informed approach be aware of (and educate students about) potential re-traumas in service activities

Developing community partnerships:

PACI

- We use a local partner to help source sites, dorm rooms, and meal plans (also helps with excursions)
- Study Abroad office: grants available to faculty to travel in advance to explore community and potential partners
