Manuscripts are being sought on Gambling Disorder and healthcare for a special issue of *Issues in Mental Health Nursing*; readership includes psych nurses, generalist nurses, physicians, ancillary healthcare providers, and interested general public. This issue is #12, December, 2020. Deadline for submission of papers is March, 2020.

Issues in Mental Health Nursing requires APA format. There is no specified page limit, but most papers range from 15 to 25 pages of double-spaced text. Accuracy in citations is imperative. Please send all manuscripts to: http://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/umhn. Indicate in your cover letter that you would like your paper to be considered for this special Gambling Disorder issue. Manuscripts will be reviewed by guest editor, Dr. Marcie Parker, Ph.D., CFLE, and by two reviewers who are blinded to the identity of the authors.
