Our goal for the 2014 conference is to examine multiple facets of globalization and their impact on families from a variety of disciplinary traditions, from a variety of research paradigms, and from a variety of practice perspectives. The hope is that conference participants will be challenged to consider their own scholarship and application from a global perspective, linking larger trends to more proximal interactions.

The conference committee seeks proposals that highlight research, theory, practice, and policies that examine and consider globalization as a force shaping contemporary families' realities. Topics of interest include global health, family strengths and resilience, migration/immigration, economics, entrepreneurship and poverty, family and couple issues related to power and gender inequality, and social and environmental justice.

### ***Overall Conference Objectives:***

- To highlight research that focuses on global trends, areas of strength and resilience, and challenges affecting families around the world.

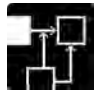

### *Positive Youth Development and Active and Engaged Citizenship: A Relational Developmental Systems Model*

Renowned scholar and theorist Dr. Richard Lerner, Bergstrom Chair in Applied Developmental Science and the Director of the Institute for Applied Research in Youth Development, Tufts University, will be speaking at this co-sponsored NCFR annual conference session. Dr. Lerner's talk will bridge the TCRM workshop and the conference. This session is open to all conference attendees.

Across the last third century, developmental psychology has transformed into developmental science, a multidisciplinary field aimed at describing, explaining, and optimizing the course of intraindividual change, and interindividual differences in intraindividual change, across the life span. The cutting edge of contemporary scholarship within developmental science is research framed by relational developmental systems theories, models that seek to understand the mutually influential relations between individual development and contextual change, represented as individual context relations, and to promote individual context exchanges that are mutually beneficial. A key, sample case of the application of relational developmental systems models occurs in regard to the formulation of a positive youth development (PYD) perspective, a strength-based model of development that seeks to understand and enhance the lives of diverse adolescents. Research derived from the 4-H Study of PYD, as well as from other longitudinal studies conducted within the Institute for Applied Research in Youth Development, will be used to illustrate that, when the strengths of young people are aligned with the resources existing in families, schools, and communities that are potentially useful in actualizing these strengths, then healthy development will occur. Accordingly, this PYD perspective illustrates that relational developmental systems theories provide an optimistic view of the potential for promoting thriving among youth, and suggests that the skills sets of researchers may be used in collaboration with community resources to identify what actions, with what youth, at what points in their developmental trajectories, may be taken in what contextual settings, to foster what facets of well-being and health among youth.

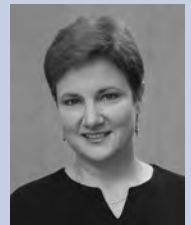

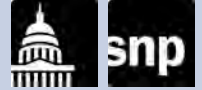

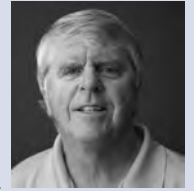

## 2013 NCFR AWARDS

### Reuben Hill Award

Reuben Hill had a distinguished career as a university professor, pioneering the scholarly study of family, and is remembered for his determination to promote high-quality research and advance theory with the intent of producing practical benefits for families. The award is presented to the author(s) of the outstanding article, book, or monograph for the previous year that combines theory and methodology in the analysis and interpretation of a significant family issue. A plaque, cash award, and travel allowance are given to the author(s) of the award-winning article.



### Recipients

Thomas Soehl and Dr. Roger Waldinger are the 2013 recipients of the Reuben Hill Award for their article "Transmission of cross-border ties in migrant families" in the *American Journal of Sociology*.



Mr. Soehl is a Ph.D. candidate in sociology at UCLA, where he is currently finishing his dissertation, "Modes of Difference and Connection: Language and Religion in Migrant Families." He earned an MPA degree from the John F. Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University, where he was a McCloy Scholar.

Dr. Waldinger is Distinguished Professor of Sociology at UCLA and a 2008 Guggenheim Fellow. He has authored six books — most recently *How the Other Half Works: Immigration and the Social Organization of Labor*.

### Felix Berardo Scholarship Award for Mentoring

Given in honor of Dr. Felix Berardo, a well-known professor at the University of Florida, who went beyond expectations in mentoring many students who became outstanding leaders in the family field. The award recognizes an NCFR member noted for excellence in mentoring one or more junior colleagues. The award includes a plaque and a \$500 stipend.



### Recipient

Marilyn Coleman is Curators' Professor Emerita at the University of Missouri and an NCFR Fellow. Dr. Coleman spent 18 years as director of graduate studies in the university's Human Development and Family Studies department and 18 years as department chair. She was the first faculty member to receive the MU Graduate Faculty Mentor Award and the first female editor of the *Journal of Marriage and Family* to serve a full term. Dr. Coleman studies post-divorce families, especially stepfamilies.

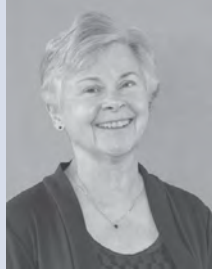

### ***What is Child Well-being? Does It Matter How We Measure It?***

**Kristin Moore, Ph.D., Presenter**

Dr. Moore is a Senior Scholar and Senior Program Area Director for Youth Development at Child Trends. She has been with Child Trends since 1982, studying child and family well-being, adolescent development, the effects of family structure and social change on children, the determinants and consequences of adolescent parenthood, the effects of poverty and welfare on children and fathers, and positive development. Dr. Moore was the founding chair of the Effective Programs and Research Task Force for the National Campaign to Prevent Teen and Unplanned Pregnancy and served as a member of the initial Board of Directors. She currently serves on advisory boards for a number of organizations, including several for the Department of Health and Human Services.



The well-being of children is often cited as a goal for public policy and programs, but the phrase holds different meanings

for stakeholders in varied fields. This talk will suggest a framework for conceptualizing and measuring child well-being and well-becoming, both positive and negative; highlight the advantages of having comparable constructs and measures across fields; and share resources for assessing and monitoring child well-being.

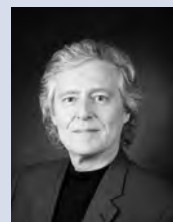
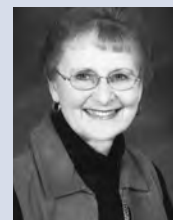

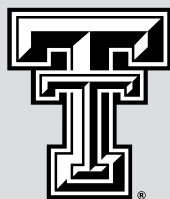

### **LGBTQ Youth Well-Being:**

#### **The Role of Parents and Policy**

**Presenter: Stephen T. Russell, Ph.D.**

Dr. Russell is the Distinguished Professor and Fitch Nesbitt Endowed Chair in Family and Consumer Sciences at the University of Arizona and serves as the Interim Director of the Norton School of Family and Consumer Sciences. He is the current President of the Society for Research on Adolescence. His research has been used to shape local and state policies and laws for school safety. His areas of expertise are: adolescent sexuality, sexual orientation and identity, adolescent health, and parent-adolescent relationships. He has a long record of external funding from such entities as NIH and the Ford Foundation. He has been honored for his mentoring, faculty contributions, and scholarship.



LGBTQ youth come out at younger ages than ever before, and historic changes in social acceptance of LGBTQ issues and lives has been extraordinary. Yet there has been more attention to homophobia in schools and in youth peer groups, with concerns for LGBTQ youth and their mental health, including suicide. This is a notable paradox: If things are so much better, why is there so much attention to LGBTQ youth and risk? I consider the role of parents and policies for supporting LGBTQ youth - including the ways that each may (or may not) buffer negative experiences among LGBTQ youth. Provocative results suggest a unique role of families in promoting policies to support the health and well-being of LGBTQ young people.

### Jessie Bernard Awards

#### Outstanding Research Proposal from a Feminist Perspective

#### Outstanding Contribution to Feminist Scholarship Paper

These awards honor Jessie Bernard, former NCFR Board Member and pioneer in the field of Feminist Family Studies. Jessie Bernard declared herself a feminist in 1970 and is known for her celebrated description of “his” and “her” marriages. She was also a board member of ASA and the Groves Conference on Marriage and Family.



The research proposal award recognizes a graduate student/new professional who has demonstrated excellence in research and potential contribution to feminist scholarship. The feminist scholarship paper award recognizes a graduate student or new professional who has published or is about to publish a paper using feminist frameworks and methodologies in research. Both include support for conference attendance and reporting on the research projects.

#### Recipient-Outstanding Research Proposal

Kimberly Crossman is a doctoral candidate in the Department of Human and Community Development at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, and was recognized for her dissertation project, “A Grounded Theory Analysis of Mothers’ Experiences of Nonviolent Coercive Control in Marriage and After Separation.” The research project, Ms. Crossman writes, “seeks to construct a theoretical understanding of the gendered nature of coercive control in intimate relationships that are not also characterized by physical violence, and the ways that social forces or institutions construct or uphold the contexts by which coercive control is possible and effective.” She says she hopes to call attention to a hidden form of intimate partner abuse and inform future research and practice efforts that address the unmet needs of women affected by nonviolent coercive control.



#### Recipient-Outstanding Contribution to Feminist Scholarship

Ana L. Jaramillo Sierra is adjunct faculty in the Department of Psychology at Universidad de los Andes in Bogotá, Colombia.



She received her Ph.D. in human development with emphasis in marriage and family therapy from Virginia Tech. Dr. Jaramillo Sierra has published in *Psychology of Men and Masculinities*, *Child Abuse and Neglect*, and *Journal of Family Psychotherapy*. Her winning paper is titled “Who Pays After the First Date? Young Men’s Discourses of the Male-Provider Role.”
