

NCFR Kathleen Briggs Outstanding Mentor Award

The Kathleen Briggs Outstanding Mentor Award was established to honor outstanding marriage and family therapy faculty and/or supervisors for their mentoring of students and new professionals in NCFR.

The award recipient will be selected based on his/her contributions to the professional and personal development of graduate students/new professionals and his/her involvement and demonstrated leadership in field of marriage and family therapy.

Nominees will be evaluated based on the written responses to the criteria listed below. Please provide complete and thorough responses indicating how the nominee exemplifies each of the selection criteria.

Please provide specific examples and a detailed description of how the nominee exemplifies the following criteria in his/her work:

1. Contributes to the professional and academic development of graduate students/new professionals
2. Participates in mentoring activities
3. Provides a nurturing environment for graduate students/new professionals
4. Promotes the involvement of graduate students/new professionals in scholarly activities
5. Demonstrates leadership in their field through active research and/or service

Nominations will be made in writing, with nomination letters providing specific examples of how the nominee meets the above criteria. A minimum of two additional letters supporting the nomination must be provided (total of three letters). Letters for nominations can come from students, new professionals or other senior colleagues. At least two letters of support must be from students or new professionals themselves.
