## Latino(a) Families and Immigration: Action Items

- 1. Empowerment of Latino youth and families → discussions of resiliency of migration and immigration in America
  - → recognition of a history of resiliency and strong efforts for social mobility and increased opportunities
  - → redefining the construct of immigration (over 600 years of migration for opportunities) as a critical source of strength

## 2. Need to educate others on Latino history and immigration policy implications

- Highlight strengths of Latino families and contributions of this marginalized group
  - → Moral, economic, sociocultural implications
- Loss of human capital
  - → understanding of contributions of Latino immigrants in the U.S.
- Spread information of contemporary policies with immigrants
  - → recognize how social exposure and how policies inform misconceptions toward Latinos
- Write to legislators to reform policies

## 3. Considerations of global/international support

- Access to sources that support the education and contributions of immigrants
- Discuss the avenues for new educational pipelines in other countries (e.g., Canada)
