

Sourcebook of Family Theories and Methodologies
Call for Authors

Approximately every ten to fifteen years, scholars in the field of family science have produced a Sourcebook of Family Theory and Methods. An editorial team (Kari Adamsons, April Few-Demo, Chris Proulx, and Kevin Roy) currently is working on a new volume that provides both a historical perspective and also a view to recent developments and future directions in theories and methods in the field of family science. The shift in the title from “Methods” (1993 edition) to “Methodologies” (proposed new edition) also reflects our intent to focus on developments in research design, conceptualization, and approach (e.g., variable centered vs. person centered, longitudinal, observational), rather than particular analyses or methods per se. **We are soliciting proposals from potential lead authors who would be interested in contributing to the new Sourcebook.**

Interested lead authors should submit a proposal by January 15, 2018, via email to SourcebookTheoriesMethods@gmail.com. Proposals should contain the following:

- Which chapter you would like to author (theory or method)
- A brief CV or biosketch highlighting your qualifications to author the proposed chapter
- A 2-page statement explaining your vision for the chapter and why you are the best person to author the chapter
- At least one writing sample showcasing your work with the theory, method, and application that you are proposing to author
- Any co-authors you also think would make a good contribution to the chapter

The Sourcebook editorial team plans to have a relatively quick turnaround on author decisions (by February 1, 2018) so that authors can begin work on their proposed chapters, with the plan being to have at least some chapters presented for feedback at the November 2018 TCRM workshop.
