1. What were your focus groups major activities or accomplishments this year?

We again had the Issues in Aging Focus Group Award for Best Student/New Professional and Professional conference abstract. The focus group meeting hosted by the 2022 Annual NCFR Conference served as a networking tool that we hope inspired some of the rich aging-related presentations on the program for the 2023 Conference. We also brainstormed potential speakers and symposia for future conferences, breaking into pairs and small groups to focus in on possible symposia collaborations.
