#### Welcome - Introductions

#### **University Reception**

This is really set up for showcasing universities and graduate programs- what can be done to make it better? Any suggestions I can give to the Board and 2024 Program Committee? It has been about the same for 15-20 years

Three program directors said they didn't pay for a table – too expensive based on ROI. Usually not getting many potential applicants.

Ashlie - it is important - could we do more to support undergraduates to come.

How could we get more UG to come - Could a portion of our reception fees go towards

Could we include a UG poster session that would funnel potential graduate students and NCFR members?

Potential employers? University position (developing professional development skills).

Is there another room to do interviewing? Large room with tables a designated time outside of the reception time – for a more quiet discussion (like the roundtable format)

Meet a graduate director or search committee chair - using Whova

Could Whova eb used to help potential graduate students

Listing faculty at each university – with the grad director mark to be able to set up a meeting?

Maybe set up a Mentorship/Grad Director event??? - - sign up to sit at specific table - -

Maybe a Session on Friday UG or MS students can register/sign up. - - meet with Grad Directors

Sign in sheets for drawing are not helpful to recruiting - we spend time describing our programs to those who have no interest in our program. They just want our signatures for the drawings.

Collect data - Could those who attend NCFR indicate WHY they care coming and what they hope to get from it. Can they indicate that they are interested in enrolling in a PhD graduate program or seeking a job for spring or fall.

We read an except from a journal article that discussed the trend of AI collecting human-like research data that replaces the need for human responses. We express our need to be cautious with the validity of graduate student research
